CONSULTATION SERVICE

The consultation service of The Educational Alliance is aimed at training staff members around mental health problems. As a result, indirect service is rendered to the agency's members. The Consultation Service occasionally provides direct service to members around psychological testing, diagnostic interviewing and short-term counselling, but only at the request of the social work staff.

These schools are: New York School of Social Work of Columbia University, New York University School of Public Administration and Social Service, University of Pennsylvania School of Social Work, Adelphi College School of Social Work, Fordham School of Social Service, Rutgers Graduate School of Social Work, and Yeshiva University Graduate School of Social Work. Undergraduate students from the local colleges receive leadership training here. In addition, qualified volunteers are leaders of groups and activities.
