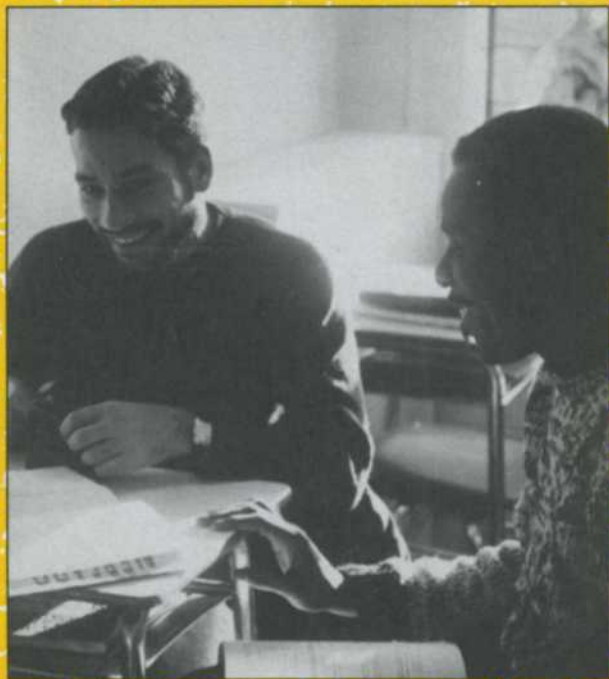

Since its founding more than 100 years ago, the Educational Alliance has been recognized as an innovative and dynamic agency committed to improving the quality of life for the multi-cultural and multi-racial residents of the Lower East Side of New York. With this goal in mind, the Alliance has dedicated its resources to helping individuals and families by developing programs and services to deal with the problems and concerns specific to each generation.



PROJECT CONTACT

The cost of substance abuse to our society in economic and social terms is staggering. The human cost to individuals, their families and to future generations is tragic. This threat to our community makes it imperative that we find the means to eradicate substance abuse from our midst.

Since 1968, the Educational Alliance has been reaching out to lost, often homeless, and frequently drug addicted individuals through a comprehensive drug prevention, intervention and treatment program called Project Contact. Its experience and successful track record in helping this population has made the Alliance a positive force for change in the community and a source of hope to help countless men, women, youth and young adults between the ages of 12 and 45.

Project Contact offers residential and non-residential programs, as well as an information and referral service that puts individuals in immediate touch with knowledgeable staff familiar with the full range of services available to substance abusers throughout the state of New York.

Project Contact programs and services create a feeling of belonging, a sense of family and the opportunity to build a new life.

GENERAL INFORMATION

ELIGIBILITY

Project Contact programs are geared to individuals with a history of chemical dependency or drug experimentation, individuals who are committed to their recovery and to becoming and remaining drug-free.

PROGRAMS

Project Contact programs provide structured environments that help clients regain control of their lives. The programs are conducted in an atmosphere of support and nurturance by staff members who possess a profound belief that people can and do change for the better.

STAFF

Project Contact staff members are psychiatrists, psychologists and social workers as well as para-professional counselors (some of whom are former drug users). They are all specifically trained to assist substance abusers in their struggle to live a drug-free existence.

SERVICES

Project Contact offers individual, group and family therapy; educational, drug and vocational counseling; vocational training and crisis intervention; and many special services that make Project Contact programs unique.

COST

Most Project Contact programs are subsidized by governmental or foundation gifts and are free to clients.

RESIDENTIAL PROGRAMS

PRIDE SITE

Pride Site is a drug-free treatment program that offers its residents a safe haven where they can face their dependency and develop healthy, socially acceptable life styles. As the name implies, the heart of the treatment approach is to instill a sense of personal worth and self-esteem in the residents. Clients in need of detoxification are referred to local hospitals that specialize in chemical dependency treatment.

AGES

Youth and young adults 16-21 years; adults 22-45 years, some of whom are homeless.

DURATION OF TREATMENT

Up to 24 months in residence with an after care program of up to one year.

SPECIAL SERVICES

Basic education courses leading to a General Education Diploma (GED); assistance in finding housing prior to release; family counseling.

COST

Free.

FUNDING

New York State Office of Alcohol and Substance Abuse Services.

AGES

Youth and young adults, 16-21 years.

REQUIREMENTS

Agency or self referrals accepted.

DURATION OF TREATMENT

3-18 months.

SPECIAL SERVICES

Health and sex education; vocational training; basic education courses with teachers provided by the Board of Education; housing, banking, medical and educational referrals prior to departure.

COST

Free.

FUNDING

New York City Department of Youth Services.

AGES

Individuals 21-45 years.

SCHEDULE

Monday-Thursday: classes and workshops, 9:00-3:00; recreational and social programs, 3:00-5:00; Friday: classes, 9:00-12:30.

DURATION OF TREATMENT

One to two years.

SPECIAL SERVICES

Programs tailored to the individual needs of the client. Offerings include self-help groups such as Alcoholics and Narcotics Anonymous meetings on premises; basic education program leading to GED, basic literacy classes (tutors available); vocational workshops in building trades, computer and clerical skills, food services; parenting workshops; and social, communal and recreational activities. Breakfast and lunch provided.

COST

Free.

Youth and young adults, 16-21 years.

HOURS

8:30-3:00.

DURATION OF TREATMENT

One to two years.

SPECIAL SERVICES

Basic education courses leading to GED with teachers provided by the Board of Education. Breakfast and lunch provided.

COST

Free.

FUNDING

New York State Office of Alcohol and Substance Abuse Services, funded as special Mental Health Chemical Dependency Program.

NON-RESIDENTIAL PROGRAMS

AGES

Youth and young adults, 10-21 years, who have chemical dependency problems or have a history of involvement with the criminal justice system.

HOURS

Monday-Saturday, 9:00-5:00.

DURATION OF TREATMENT

Up to 18 months.

SPECIAL SERVICES

Prevention and intervention program employing outreach and drug intervention workers as well as precinct counselors and community service. Referrals are made to other community organizations and programs.

COST

Free; stipends are offered.

FUNDING

New York City Department of Youth Services.

Youth and young adults, 13-18 years (Junior and Senior High School students from throughout Manhattan) who are at risk of running away or using drugs.

SPECIALSERVICES

Speaker's Bureau (participants address other student group on drug abuse); Peer Counseling Training Program; Youth Directory (list of city sponsored youth services in Manhattan); Newsletter; Video Production workshop.

COST

Free; stipends available for transportation.

FUNDING

Office of Human Development Services, Agency for Children and Families.

NON-RESIDENTIAL PROGRAMS

Individuals 18 years and up.

DURATION OF TREATMENT

Up to 18 months.

SPECIALSERVICES
