The **EDUCATIONAL WORK OF THE ALLIANCE** is comprised under the following heads:

The Department of Literature and Science includes courses in Language, Literature, History, Science and Politics.

The Commercial Department offers courses in Bookkeeping, Stenography, Typewriting and Telegraphy.

The Department of Domestic Art embraces courses in Millinery, Dress-making, Sewing, and Art-Needlework.

The Department of Domestic Science is designed for practical house-keepers.

The Department of Fine Arts is designed primarily for young people and for those who cannot attend the art schools uptown.

The Kindergarten is intended for the children who cannot be accommodated at the Kindergartens of the Board of Education.

The Classes in English for Immigrants are intended to prepare the children of immigrants for the public schools. Children may enter immediately upon their arrival in this country.

The Department of Hebrew and Religion is intended primarily for children under thirteen years of age, who must attend the public schools. The purpose of this instruction is to train the students in the Hebrew language and in the ethical principles underlying the Jewish religion.

Public Lectures on various topics of current interest form an attractive feature of the educational work of the Alliance.

Public Exhibitions are held in the rooms of the Alliance at which masterpieces in oil and water colors are displayed. Flower exhibits are also provided from time to time.

The Club Department has been organized to meet the social needs of the community. In these clubs students of all ages may find congenial companions and those whose aims harmonize with their own.

In addition to these classes under the supervision of the Committee on Education, there are also courses in physical training.

The Department of Physical Training is devoted to both indoor and outdoor exercises. The aim of the department is to train the muscles and the nerves, bringing the body under control of the will and producing better confidence in self.
